1) WEEKENDS:

Every _____ weekend from Friday at 6:00 p.m. until Sunday at 6:00 p.m.
(Begins _____, 20__).

Every other weekend from Friday at 6:00 p.m. until Sunday at 6:00 p.m. If the weekend is a three day weekend, the Friday or Monday of the long weekend shall be included. (Begins _____, 20__).

2) OFF-WEEK VISITATION:

During the week when there is no weekend visitation:

6:00 p.m. the Thursday preceding the weekend when visiting parent does not have visitation until Friday morning when school begins.

3) SUMMER:

Four (4) weeks, to be taken in up to two-two week intervals. Visiting parent selects his/her time by April 1st in odd years, custodial parent then selects by May 1st. Custodial parent will select his/her two (2) weeks in even years by April 1st, visiting parent then selects his/her two (2) weeks by May 1st. Failure to give notice as required will result in the custodial parent choosing the weeks of visitation, but not in denial of visitation. All selections must be by certified mail or e-mail.

4) HOLIDAYS:

ALL MAJOR HOLIDAYS ARE TO BE ALTERNATED BETWEEN THE PARENTS:

A) CHRISTMAS:

Week One: From when school dismisses for the holidays in the school district where the child(ren) reside until 2:00 p.m. Christmas Day (Even years _____/Odd years _____).

Week Two: 2:00 p.m. Christmas Day until 6:00 p.m. the day before school resumes in the district where the child(ren) reside (Even years _____/Odd years _____).

B) THANKSGIVING:

From when school dismisses for the Thanksgiving holiday until 6:00 p.m. Sunday
(Even years _____/Odd years _____).

C) SPRING BREAK:

From when school dismisses for Spring Break until 6:00 p.m. the day before school
resumes (Even years _____/Odd years _____).

D) MOTHER'S DAY:

From 6:00 p.m. the Friday prior until 6:00 p.m. Sunday with the Mother.

E) FATHER'S DAY:

From 6:00 p.m. the Friday prior until 6:00 p.m. Sunday with the Father.

F) LABOR DAY WEEKEND:

From 6:00 p.m. the Friday prior until 6:00 p.m. Monday (Even years _____/Odd
years _____).

G) MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND:

From 6:00 p.m. the Friday prior until 6:00 p.m. Monday (Even years _____/Odd
years _____).

H) CHILD(REN)'S BIRTHDAY:

The non-custodial parent for that day will get from 2:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. If the
child's birthday falls on a school day, the non-custodial parent for that day will get
from when school releases until 6:30 p.m.

I) PARENT'S BIRTHDAY:

Each parent will get the child(ren) on his birthday for 4 hours selected by him or her.
The party exercising visitation on his or her birthday must advise the other party 72
hours in advance as to the 4 hour time frame they will be exercising visitation. If the
birthday falls on a weekend, holiday, or summer break, the non-custodial parent for
that day will get from 2:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

5) RESTRICTIONS:

- Expose the child(ren) to violent conduct.
- Expose the child(ren) to a non-spouse romantic companion overnight or
under circumstances that are immoral or illegal. (See SC Code §16-15-
80) (Overnight being from 10:00 p.m. until 7:00 a.m.)

- Expose the child(ren) to any non-spouse romantic companion.
- Expose the child(ren) to the use or possession of alcohol, drugs, or other intoxicants. No use is allowed within 24 hours of contact with the child(ren).
- Expose the child(ren) to the excessive use of alcohol or other legal intoxicants or any use or possession of illegal drugs or intoxicants.
- Remove the child(ren) from _____ without a court order.
- Make or allow disparaging comments about the other parent/party or his/her family in the presence of the child(ren).
- Use or allow the use of vulgar, profane, demeaning, violent, or threatening language in the presence of the child(ren).
- Expose the child(ren) to sexually explicit conduct, language, TV, videos, movies, books, photographs, or materials of any kind.
- Discuss this case with or in the presence of the child(ren).
- Exercise any visitation unless supervised by _____ or another person first approved in writing by the custodial parent/party or the GAL.
- Expose the child(ren) to smoke from any tobacco or other smoking product.
- Expose the child(ren) to any illegal or criminal activity.

6) AFFIRMATIVE DUTIES:

- a. Proper child(ren) restraints must be used when transporting the minor child(ren).
- b. Minor child(ren) must have his or her own bed with proper accommodations (clean sheets, proper climate control, etc.)
- c. Age appropriate child proofing in each parties home.
- d. Minor child(ren) to be bathed and provided clean clothes daily.
- e. Parties must ensure all necessary safety precautions when the minor child(ren) is engaged in extra-curricular activities (helmet when riding a bike, etc.)
- f. To inform the other parent of school events/activities and medical appointments, etc. as soon as the custodial parent has knowledge.

7) TELEPHONE:

Custodial parent will deliver for visitation and visiting parent will return the child(ren) after visitation.

Parents will meet for pick-up and delivery.

9) GENERAL INFORMATION:
